They selected the steel container by the tennis court as their canvas as they felt this would be an eyecatching location, they brainstormed ideas, and worked as a team to finalise their design and message. The mural is titled 'Be Yourself' and incorporates other messages of 'Reach your goals', 'Shoot for the stars' 'Know your worth' and 'Believe' it is painted in bright colours to reinforce its positive mental health message. Students enjoyed learning about the design process, the execution of an idea and they got to use spray paints.



Scoil Aireagail TY Art students Amber's One Million Stars Ireland project Amber's One Million Stars Ireland project is an inclusive community arts project connecting communities across Ireland in solidarity against domestic abuse and all forms of violence. Scoil Aireagail TY Art students began our project back in November when they learned how to weave the eight-pointed star. Each eight-point star woven represents light, hope and solidarity against domestic, sexual and gender-based violence, promoting our project's eight points of healthy love within relationships. Stars were then curated into our 'Love-heart' installation, which was today hung at the entrance to our school. The idea is to educate this generation to recognise healthy relationships and to spread love and hope for a future free from violence and abuse for all in our community. Similar projects can be seen in Market Cross Kilkenny, the aim is to weave one million stars, Scoil Aireagail students created their art installation with over 300 stars. In addition, guest speakers from Amber House Women's refuge came into the school today and did a workshop with TY students. They spoke about healthy relationships v's abusive and controlling ones, how to recognise the red flags, and where to go for help. A special thanks to Amber House it was informative and educational. In return TY students organised a non-uniform day, all students wore red or pink to school today to celebrate Love and hope for Valentines. All monies raised from our non-uniform day will be donated to Amber House Women's refuge.

TY's participated in many talks and workshops this term including:

A workshop run by the Kilkenny Rape Crisis Centre (KAMA) and a Garda Inspector from the Garda Divisional Protective Services Unit. TY and 5^{th} Year students had a workshop with Ursula Clancy, a Community Information Nurse from the Marie Keating Foundation. She spoke to our students about some the risks associated with cancer and how they can help reduce the risks.

Over a number of weeks during February/March, our TY students participated in the Aware Programme. This is a life skills programme that is designed to help people learn to better manage the stress of everyday life, recognise, and manage unhelpful thoughts and learn how to live a happier and more confident life. A big thank you to Eileen for facilitating the course. TY students also completed a First Aid course with Tommy Bawle from Kilkenny Physical **Therapy**. They learned valuable lifesaving skills and found all they learned very useful. TY students also took part in a driver education workshop with Woods Driving School. Our students learned valuable skills such as changing a wheel on a car, checking tyres and a mock theory test. Thanks to Jenny Woods for facilitating the workshop.

TVs also took part in a **self defence programme run by Personal Safety director Alex Walsh**. The programme is a very valuable one that develops students' personal safety and awareness. Students learned how to assess different situations and the methods on how best to protect themselves if the need arises.
